Diseases protected against	Comments and example trade names of adult preparations	
Anthrax	Rarely given available only through Public Health England.	Non-Live
Cholera	Oral vaccine. Dukoral®	Non-Live
Diphtheria	Would usually be given as Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis often with Polio in older children and adults, Boostrix-IPV®, Revaxis®, Repevax®	Non-Live
HiB	Haemophilus influenza, Menitorex®	Non-Live
Hepatitis A	May be combined with typhoid or hepatitis B. Avaxim®, Epaxal®, Ambirix®, Twinrix®, Hapatyrix®, Viatim®	Non-Live
Hepatitis B	May be combined with hepatitis A If unexposed and more than 7 days from last immunisation, accept. See: Hepatitis B – Immunisation	Non-Live
	Engerix®, Fendrix®, HBvaxPRO®, Ambirix®, Twinrix®	
HPV	Usually given to teenage girls, Cervarix®, Gardasil®	Non-Live
Influenza-intra-nasal	Fluenz® to age 18	<u>Live</u>
Influenza	Injection-annual flu jab. Agrippal®, Enzira®, Fluarix®, Fluvirin®, Imuvac®, Influvac®, Intanza® Optaflu®, Pandemrix®	Non-Live
Japanese Encephalitis	Travel. Ixiaro®	Non-Live
Measles, Mumps, Rubella	MMR vaccines. M-M-RvaxPro®, Priorix®	<u>Live</u>
Meningitis	Meningococcal group C, Meningococcal group B and the Quadrivalent ACWY immunisation may also be given in combination with HiB. Meningitec®, Menjugate Kit®, NeisVac-C®, Bexsero®, Menveo®, Nimenrix®	Non-Live

Pertussis	Usually pregnant women, Boostrix-IPV®	Non-Live
Pneumococcal disease	Given to people with specific risks e.g Asplenic. And over 65s Pneumovax II®	Non-Live
Polio	Would usually be given Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio (injection). Boostrix-IPV®, Revaxis®, Repevax®	Non-Live
Rabies	Travel or post-bite. Rabipur®	Non-Live
Shingles	Routine immunisation for older people. Zostavax®	<u>Live</u>
Smallpox	Rarely given, see: Smallpox Immunization	<u>Live</u>
Tetanus	Would usually be given Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio. Revaxis®	Non-Live
Tick-borne encephalitis	Tico-vac®	Non-Live
Tuberculosis	BCG vaccine	<u>Live</u>
Typhoid - injected	Typherix®, Typhim Vi®	Non-Live
Typhoid - Oral	Vivotif®	<u>Live</u>
Varicella (chickenpox)	Mainly healthcare workers. Varilrix®, Varivax®,	<u>Live</u>
Yellow Fever	Travel. Stamaril®	<u>Live</u>
